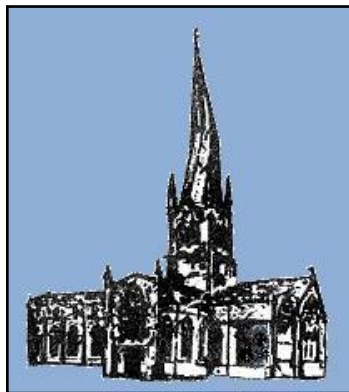

**Derbyshire Records
Office**

The £4m face lift was funded by the County Council and sees the consolidation of the main Local Studies Library and the Archive Service onto one site.

There is extra space to run workshops, and exhibition space, a new break area for visitors to relax and take refreshments, also a new state-of-the-art-store for 15 years growth.

Re-opened in February the records office in Matlock, Derbyshire, holds documents created by individuals, families, and organizations, and currently has more than five miles of original records going back nearly 800 years.

Along side guides to individual collections their website has other finding aids, including an on-line catalogue, a database of the Local Studies historical reference library and blog.

Also photos of the war memorials.

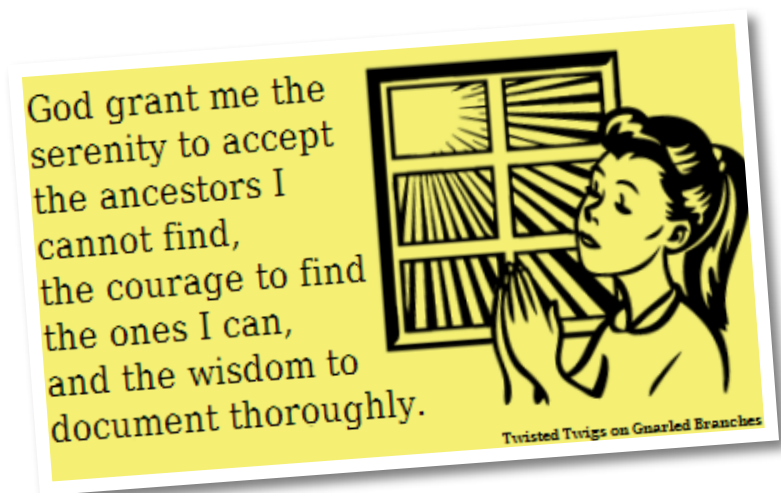
