“Losing Ancestors to Descent”

Celia Renshaw has been researching her own families and those of friends and cousins around the world for 14 years. She has always had a keen interest in history, especially at local level, and quickly became addicted to the ‘detective-work’ and puzzle-solving of genealogy.

Over the years, and quite by accident, she has gained expertise in religious dissent, or non-conformity, from the Protestant Reformation in the Tudor period through to the 20th century. Her special interest is in Puritans and Quakers, especially those who jumped the pond to the new world, and is currently learning more about various types of Methodism.

Her presentation “Ancestors Lost to Dissent” will explain why religious non- conformity in England is important to family researchers, how to recognise when ancestors over the centuries may have been dissenters and the many informative sources that are available.

What sort of documents might you find in the 'Parish Chest'

THE PARISH CHEST -THERE WAS MORE TO LIFE THAN BAPTISM, MARRIAGE AND BURIAL

At our August meeting Kate henderson, engaged our attention and provoked much thought with what I might call a tutorial, its title 'Examine & Explore Original Documents'. It was fascinating and I had never realised just how much other stuff can be found by rummaging in the **Parish Chest** on which the largest part of her talk was about.

However we were warned that as with other documents they may not all have survived. But definitely worth a delve. Where will you find them?

Mainly at you local records office.

So what might we find?

What is the Parish and what role did it play in your ancestors lives?

The records and accounts of the parish make up what is collectively called the **parish chest**. From the reign of Elizabeth I the parish's role in local affairs expanded to include many civil responsibilities that affected the lives of your ancestors. Parish officers - the churchwardens and overseers - raised taxes, kept accounts and managed parish affairs including maintaining the church, providing relief to the poor, settle entitlements, setting local rates, repairing roads, maintaining law and order, and operating schools. You will discover other fascinating records as well, among them the wills of benefactors, militia records and parish magazines.

Churchwardens, Overseers and Vestry records.

Property and Land Records. Quarter sessions.

The Parish Constable, School Records and Other Records.
