November the 3rd - Member Brenda Bubb gave us a history Lesson re the Peninsular and Boer wars.

Brenda's story covered her own family tree where 3 generations of her mother's forefathers had been involved with the military in these wars. The latter her Grandpa Frank was a congregational Minister in Johannesburg. He kept a journal that is now over 110 years old. This fragile personal account was on display for us and the book is about 15" by 12". Also on display were several beaded craft items made by the Zulus at that time and were gifts to her grandparents.

Following her family history, Brenda's illustrated presentation supported the story as it unfolded. Photographs from the journal had been carefully scanned so that we could enjoy them on the big screen. Frank's personal accounts were read out by Brenda and photographs of famed people such as Robert Baden Powell, Powell Redver (Henry) Buller and Lord Roberts were on the screens for us to see. (Recognise the names of Chesterfield Streets?)

Frank lived and worked as a missionary in the middle of Johannesburg before the British took it over. But as the war spread many other men of the cloth were sent home, however Frank was allowed to stay and to this we are so grateful as without this, there would not have been such a wonderful story for Brenda to tell.

Frank spent quite a while with the Boers who did not thirst for war at all and so when the time came the British were able to walk in to Johannesburg virtually un-opposed. Many of the Boers who left asking Frank to look after their belongings, so presumably hoped that would be back sooner rather than later. Frank came back to England where he became engaged but then went back to Johannesburg. His fiancée followed him and so they were wed. Tragedy struck when their bright and beautiful young son died of malaria and following this they returned to England never to return. Although (?????) was fragile and was told no more children she had a surprise daughter Edith at the age of 39 and in 1917. To this Brenda is eternally grateful as Edith was her mother.



Did you know?

Two separate Boer Wars were fought between the British Empire and two independent Boer states. The war commonly known as the 'Boer War' is the second Boer War 1899-1902.

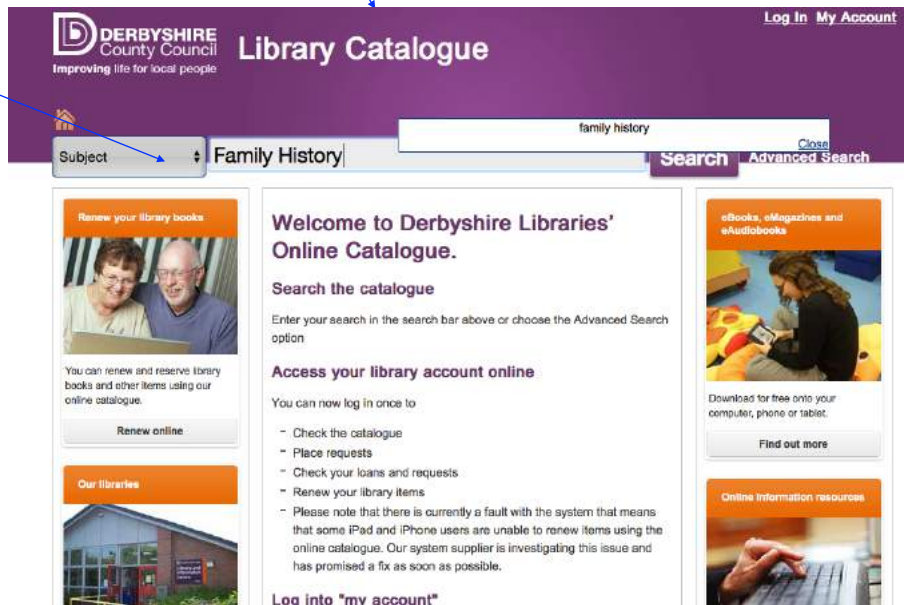
